
A chronic shortage of qualified teachers to serve roughly 5000 Montessori programs across the nation, 495 of which are public schools serving vulnerable populations.

Opportunity


Well established training programs have capacity for greater enrollment. The institutional capacity already exists to alleviate the teacher shortage.


